



A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR . . .

**Preaching the Absolution: A Sacrament
Comfort for Those Who Cannot Gather for a
Time During a Pandemic.**



It seems that a clear, strong theology of preaching is needed more than ever in the middle of a pandemic, when churches are being closed, people are ordered to stay in their homes, or for health reasons ought not to leave their homes. In this technological age where we are also, suddenly, though temporarily, either strongly urged to “stay home,” or directly ordered by our

governors to shelter-in-place, many millions of Americans are waiting and searching for a good word of hope and will resort to listening to streaming worship services and preaching on-line.

When preaching does what it is supposed to do, it is sacramental. To preach is to bestow Jesus Christ as promise to sinners. Therefore, right preaching gives Christ sacramentally to sinners. The Lord’s Supper, baptism, and preaching all do the same thing, though differently.

Just as the Lord’s supper puts Jesus Christ, whole & complete, human and divine, body and blood, bread and wine, in the mouth of sinners for the forgiveness of their sin ([Matthew 26:26-28](#)), so also, preaching is to stuff Jesus Christ, whole and complete, human and divine, without remainder, in the ears of actual sinners for the forgiveness of their sins ([Acts 13:38](#)).

Just as baptism washes the sinner with Jesus Christ, whole and complete, human and divine, by the promise-worded water for the forgiveness of sin ([Acts 2:38](#)), new life ([Romans 6:4](#)) and salvation ([1 Peter 3:21](#)), so, preaching is to wash the sinner’s ears with Jesus Christ, whole & complete, human and divine, by the direct and verbal announcement of the absolution.

Such preaching is sacramental because it bestows Christ to sinners as an unconditional gift, gratis.

In the *Augsburg Confession*, in the apology to the thirteenth article titled “The Number and Use of the Sacraments,” we confess, “Therefore, the sacraments are actually baptism, the Lord’s Supper, and absolution (the sacrament of penance).” In baptism, Christ is poured on the sinner for the forgiveness of sins. In the Lord’s Supper Christ is poured in the mouth of the sinner for the forgiveness of sins. In the absolution, Christ is poured into the hearth through the ear of the sinner for the forgiveness of sins. Christ is truly present, human and divine in the preaching and the hearing of the word of absolution ([Romans 10:17](#)). He is truly present in the preaching of the law that kills the old Adam and the gospel that raises the new creature of faith.

Christians who, for a time, cannot gather for reasons beyond their control to receive the Lord’s Supper, may take comfort during this time of social distancing, that when the Father finds a way to get Christ’s preachers to pour Jesus Christ and his cross, withholding nothing, into your ears, it is the same, entire Jesus Christ who justifies, sanctifies, and saves ([1 Corinthians 1:30](#)) sinners through the sacraments of baptism and the Lord’s Supper. Sacramental preaching delivers the same Jesus Christ who is entirely and truly present for you in baptism and the Lord’s Supper.

In the hearing of Jesus Christ and his forgiveness of your sins, you have nothing less than new life with Christ, freedom from the law, sin, wrath, and the bondage of the devil, and the promise of the resurrection from death to eternal life with Him. In the preaching of the absolution, “Your sins are forgiven on account of Jesus Christ,” Jesus Christ himself erases the distance between you and unites himself to you.

He is your refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble ([Psalm 46:1](#)). He is your shelter-in-place, not to separate you from him in terror, but to unite you with himself in the hearing of his promise for you.

I hope to have a weekly education plan available to you, soon, should you like to follow. Please navigate through the page and thumbnails. You can use as little or as much as you desire of their resources.

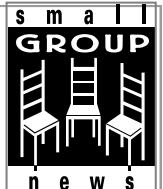

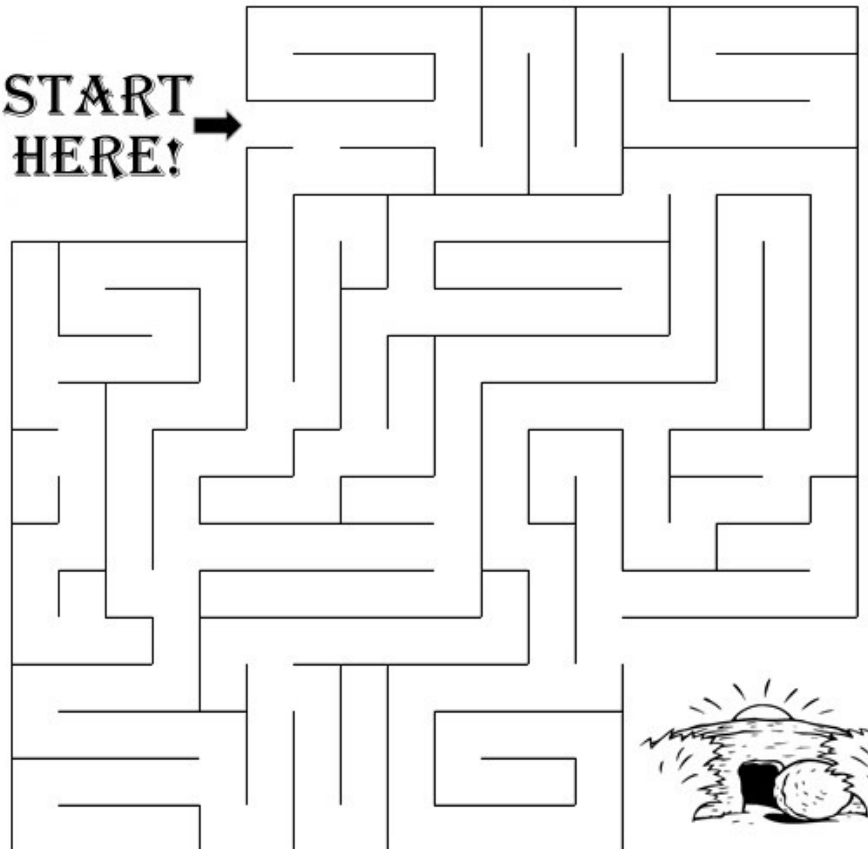

Old Business:

1. Council needs to review the membership list annually, per the Constitution (Chapter 12.06 f.) Mark forwarded the list to each Council member for review & we will discuss at the next meeting.
2. Status of calling Pastor Marney as Associate Pastor: This item is pending. Council has been reviewing the Constitution and Bylaws and will determine our next step at the next meeting.
3. Council needs to appoint a Financial Secretary (Bylaws Part V.C.1) as Alan Westfall will be transferring out of Zion by the end of the month. This item is pending as we have no one available at this time.

New Business & Action Items:

1. **Alan** has offered to continue in the role of Financial Secretary as a non-member until we can find a replacement for him. **Motion to allow** Alan to continue as Financial Secretary until we can find a replacement. **MSP** with one opposed.
2. **Alan** also provides pc tech support for the office, but is willing to continue volunteering his time if the Council approves it. **Motion to allow** Alan to continue as pc tech support. **MSP**
3. **Personnel Committee** requested that Council entertain two motions. Sound and Video Technician Charlie plans to continue in his role for the short term, but is looking to step back from this responsibility as he prepares for graduation in June and other job opportunities. Andrew has been in training for the last couple of months, and he is ready to take on more of an independent role in this position. While we might see a few services overlap where we would be paying both, most services will be supported independently by one or the other technician and should not affect the current approved 2020 budget for this line item.
 - **Motion to approve** the hire of Andrew as a Sound and Video Technician. **MSP**
 - **Motion to approve** the contract for Andrew in the position of Sound and Video Technician. **MSP**
4. **Motion to appoint** Johanna, Steve, Judi and Kent to the Audit committee. **MSP**
5. We have several people willing to be on the **Budget Committee** but need one or two additional members from the congregation. Item tabled as this isn't required until the July meeting.
6. Discussed **Lenten Soup Supper** March 25th. Question asked whether or not to cancel due to Covid-19 Coronavirus concerns. Pastor provided King County Public Health Dept. recommendations. Special precautions will be taken, we'll leave it up to members to decide whether to attend or stay home. **Motion to continue** with tomorrow's supper. **MSP**
7. Discussed whether or not to **cancel communion temporarily**. Decided to proceed for now with additional precautions. If anyone in the congregation gets sick, they are asked to let the office know so appropriate steps can be taken.
8. We also discussed the fact that some churches are **streaming their worship services**. Tim Irwin will look into necessary equipment, etc.

9. Pastor Marney **requested funds for technology hardware** for the Ed Building that weren't in the Technology budget. **Motion to approve** the purchase of equipment up to \$2900 from the appropriate budget line. **MSP**
